



has been dancing since she was 8. She is the organizer of the Buenos Aires Dance Congress.

2005 he began studying Ballroom Dancing and has an undergraduate degree in Physical
Education, and specializes in dances and body conscience.

Romi and Leo met in 2007 and paired up in 2013 in Porto Seguro, Brazil. They have developed new moves, concepts and technical developments with a different style within the same genre. Invited to "Dance in the Desert"

"Liz Lerman has never lost her inner child, her ability to see the world with wonderment and optimism in the face of an often grim and divisive society. She is inspiring. Liz is one of the most generous of spirit people I know while being a realist and very strong in her convictions. She is not intimidated by anyone and often takes on difficult situations in her work, but at the same time has an amazing talent for finding commonalities in divergent people and very effective ways of bringing them together.

I love Liz's sense of humor and ability to make everyone around her feel at ease, regardless of the situation."

Professorship wasn't on the agenda for Liz Lerman until she was invited by Steven Tepper, Dean of the Herberger Institute for Design and the Arts at the Arizona State University, to join him and others on their mission to create a model program producing graduates who are the creative problemsolvers the world needs. Tepper calls Lerman's work as a choreographer, performer and writer "transformative." (Phoenix New Times, Lynn Trimble, November 4, 2014)

Lerman is a multidisciplinary dancer/producer and her work has taken her to places and people one would not imagine - like choreographing bulldozers for a street performance, for instance. Blending generations and people from different fields of work and life and teaching them how to "choreograph" and present their thoughts and ideas has been her mission based on a single word ~ curiosity. When you are curious, you inquire, gather information, learn, problem-solve and find inspiration to create art/work. This process engages the community and ASU found the perfect entrepreneur—a dancer—to teach their students this process. "This is an incredible opportunity to leverage the talent of this great university to advance what has always been for me the intersection of artistic practice for the stage with broader civic purposes," states Lerman. (ASU Now, January 7, 2016)

This semester Lerman is teaching *Transitions Project* for ASU Dance seniors. Next semester *Animating Research* is on the curriculum integrating her *Critical Response Process (CRP)*—a four-step system for giving and receiving feedback on artistic works in progress. She's also involved in creating the *Ensemble Lab* of artists, scholars and community leaders to begin their experiments for broad social impact.

An Interview with Susannah Keita, M.F.A., Director of Dance at Grand Canyon University

This week I had the pleasure of sitting down with Susannah Keita, M.F.A. to discuss the dance program at Grand Canyon University. Keita has been the director of the program since


its inception in 2010. She started with seven Dance Education majors and has worked hard to increase the size and visibility of the program. The original degree, a B.A. in Dance Education, leads to

initial teacher licensure in dance for Pre-K-12 grades in Arizona. Recently the program began offering a new degree program, the B.A. in Dance, focusing on performance and creative practices. Now the two degree offerings have more than 60 majors and 30 minors. Everyone has seen the immense growth of the physical campus at GCU and the dance department is working hard to grow as well.



What are some of the unique features of the Dance Department at GCU?

One of the most unique features of the dance department here is that we are committed to holding equal space for students who have had access to large amounts of technical training through studios and arts schools as well as students who, for one reason or another, have only had access to the training offered in public or charter schools. Our goal is not to train the dancers who are already the best, but rather to train the dancers who are the most passionate and most committed to self-discovery and self-improvement. These will be the educators and artists we look to for the





Our program is also triple-track, focusing on ballet, modern, and jazz. All students work equally in all three techniques. We are also committed to offering tap and hip hop or urban styles of dance as a way to honor the vernacular traditions of dance here in the U.S. and prepare our students to tackle a wide array of careers after graduation.

What are some of the accomplishments you are proud of for the department?

I am proud of how connected our department is to the community. We participate every semester in several fund raising walks and volunteer events. We participate in Ballet Arizona's class warm-ups for elementary school students. Our Student Dance Education Organization or SDEO organizes community performances for our students as well as additional volunteer opportunities. We also participate every year in American College Dance Association's regional conferences. Our students take classes, network, and perform their own choreography for adjudication at these conferences

each year. This year we are travelling to Modesto, California. I'd also like to praise our graduates who are out there leading programs in our area schools, igniting a passion for dance among their own students.

What are some of your proudest moments as Director of Dance at GCU?

I am supremely proud of the growth in quality of our concerts both for student choreography and our faculty shows. The choreography, performance, and production values of our productions have grown semester by semester and our community has taken notice. Our shows are now regularly packed with both students and community members and this is great to see.

I am also proud of the work we have done bringing in guest artists. We have tried to bring both local and outside guest artists for our students to experience. I am most proud when a guest artist is impressed by our department and wants to return. Recently Alicia Nascimiento came from Brazil to teach master cases to or students. She was so impressed with our students she has asked to come back and set work on them for performance. Hearing that makes me very proud of what we have built.

What do you see for the future of the dance department at GCU?

I hope we can grow to match the growth of GCU in general. Every year we look to expand our cohort and bring a bigger student population. Our course offerings are expanding as our first group of B.A. Dance students progress towards graduation. Continue to try and connect with local guest artists and expand our relationships with nationally and internationally known artists.

You've mentioned that your program offers tap and hip hop/urban. Why is this important?

I think it is important to value traditionally vernacular art forms and find a home for them in academic settings, especially in dance. The history of dance in this country would be very different without the influence of African American social dance in particular. Without this influence, an entire generation would not have been exposed to dance through music videos and concerts. Without tap, the world of musical theatre would look very different today. We need to honor these dance forms and find a place for them in academia through classes, performance, and research.




