




# Esperanza Dance Project presents "Emerging Choreographers Showcase"

# SPOTLIGHT ON ANGELINA RAMIREZ

**Angelina Ramirez** is a 2022 Dance/USA Artist Fellow and recipient of WESTAF's BIPOC Artist Fund Award! We are happy to share her accomplishments and highlights of her work.



#### **Congratulations, Angelina!**

Angelina Ramirez is a flamenco dancer and teaching artist living in Tucson, Arizona. Ramirez's artistic work explores what it means to be a queer, latina flamenca, practicing in a traditional Roma/Gitano form of dance.

As a teaching artist, she is interested in the intersections of arts and healing, focusing on work with elders of all abilities and integrated flamenco with autistic individuals. She is devoted to promoting accessibility and eradicating ableism, racism and bigotry by practicing and promoting dialogue, acceptance and community participation.

Along with teaching and performing Ramirez produces events and festivals and is currently the curator for the Traditional and Ethnic Dance Festival with the Southwest Folklife Alliance. Ramirez is an original member of Yjastros, the American Flamenco Repertory Company and has toured with world-renowned, New York-based company Noche Flamenca.

In 2021, she received the Master-Apprentice Artist Award through Southwest Folklife Alliance for her dedication and commitment to flamenco arts. Ramirez is a National Association of Latino Arts and Cultures National Association of Latino Arts and Cultures fellow. In 2018, she received the Arizona Commission on the Arts' Artist Research and Development Grant to support the development of her evening-length work /SER/.

# SPOTLIGHT ON LIZ LERMAN

**Liz Lerman**, Choreographer, Tempe, Arizona; Institute Professor, School of Music, Dance and Theatre, Arizona State University, was awarded 2023 John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation Fellow for Choreography in the US & Canada Competition.



#### Congratulations, Liz!

Liz Lerman is a choreographer, writer, educator, and speaker, and the recipient of honors including a 2023 Guggenheim Fellowship, 2002 MacArthur "Genius Grant" and a 2017 Jacob's Pillow Dance Award. Key to her artistry is opening her process to various publics, resulting in research and outcomes that are multi-disciplinary, participatory, urgent, and funny. Current projects include building the Atlas of Creative Tools, an online resource, her touring production of Wicked Bodies, and the retrospective at Yerba Buena Center for the Arts titled Reflection & Action. She founded Dance Exchange in 1976 and led it until 2011. Liz is the author of several books including *Teaching Dance to Senior Adults*, *Hiking the Horizontal*, and most recently, co-authoring *Critique is* 

*Creative* with John Borstel, which addresses the Critical Response Process: a communication system for giving and receiving feedback that she invented decades ago. She is currently Institute Professor at the Herberger Institute for Design and the Arts at Arizona State University. A former fellow of the Robert W. On April 5, 2023, the Board of Trustees of the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation approved the awarding of Guggenheim Fellowships to a diverse group of 171 exceptional individuals, including: scientists, writers, scholars, and artists honored across 48 fields. Chosen from a rigorous application and peer review process out of almost 2,500 applicants, these successful applicants were appointed on the basis of prior achievement and exceptional promise. "Like Emerson, I believe that fullness in life comes from following our calling," said Edward Hirsch, President of the Guggenheim Foundation and 1985 Fellow in Poetry. "The new class of Fellows has followed their calling to enhance all of our lives, to provide greater human knowledge and deeper understanding. We're lucky to look to them to bring us into the future."

In all, **48** scholarly disciplines and artistic fields, **72** different academic institutions, **24** states and the District of Columbia, and two Canadian provinces are represented in this year's class of Fellows, who range in age from **31 to 85**. Close to **50** Fellows have no current full-time college or university affiliation. Many Fellows' projects directly respond to issues like the lasting effects of the Covid-19 pandemic, democracy and policing, scientific innovation, climate change, and identity.

#### About the Guggenheim Foundation

Created and initially funded in 1925 by Senator Simon and Olga Guggenheim in memory of their son John Simon Guggenheim, the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation has sought since its inception to "further the development of scholars and artists by assisting them to engage in research in any field of knowledge and creation in any of the arts, under the freest possible conditions."

Since its establishment, the Foundation has granted nearly \$400 million in Fellowships to over 18,000 individuals, among whom are more than 125 Nobel laureates, members of all the national academies, winners of the Pulitzer Prize, Fields Medal, Turing Award, Bancroft Prize, National

Book Award, and other internationally recognized honors. The great range of fields of study is a unique characteristic of the Fellowship program.

The Foundation centers the talents and instincts of the Fellows, whose passions often have broad and immediate impact. For example, Zora Neale Hurston wrote *Their Eyes Were Watching God* in 1936 with the support of a Guggenheim Fellowship and dedicated it to the Foundation's first president, Henry Allen Moe. Photographer Robert Frank's seminal book, *The Americans*, was the product of a cross-country tour supported by two Guggenheim Fellowships. The accomplishments of other early Fellows like Jacob Lawrence, Rachel Carson, James Baldwin, Martha Graham, and Linus Pauling also demonstrate the strength of the Foundation's core values and the power and impact of its approach.

#### FINAL DANCE CONCERT / CLOSURE OF DANCE DEPARTMENT

DancEstrella, Estrella Mountain Community College's student company under the artistic direction of Professor Janaea Lyn McAlee, will present *Pull Me Through.* This will be the final four performances of the EMCC dance program which is being discontinued at the end of the academic year. This production is a celebration of ten years of EMCC dance and features Practicum projects by graduating majors; collaborative choreography by students in Dance Performance classes; a new dance by Guest Choreographer and program graduate Eva Patricia Rincón with Lawrence Fung; and a final dance created and performed by the full company with guest dance program graduates. Presented by the Arts and Composition Division, performances will take place at the EMCC Performing Arts Center (PAC) in Avondale on Friday, April 28 and Saturday, April 29, 2023. Shows are at 3:00pm and 7:00pm both days and general admission is free. Audience members will have the opportunity to participate in a Q & A session with the dancers at the end of each show. Masks are recommended but optional.

Professor McAlee explains the theme of the dances choreographed for this production. "There are many ways we deal, accept, and move through challenges, adversity and loss. We wanted to honor all the forms of positive support we have from the people in our lives; through dance and art-making; and with each other in the community we have created here." She describes the final group dance, *The Ties That Bind,* as "an homage to the community of students and productions that have graced the Performing Arts stage. Dancers with diverse movement styles and life experience have come back to honor our time together and mourn the loss of the program by celebrating the enduring bond which lives on in our hearts."

Practicum Projects are group dances choreographed by graduating dance majors. *In My Unfolding* is by John Austin Boston who explains that "This dance looks at all of the many different identities a single person has within themselves. It explores ideas of dissonance, harmony, and acceptance, all with the ultimate goal of forgiving ourselves." In *Chronicle Article,* Mya Fallon explains that she is interested in "the ways in which sharing global and cultural traditions, including generational trauma, can lead to unexpected community with others through a deeper understanding of our shared humanity." *Kindred* is by Ryleigh Richards which she describes as "all about the people who provide you support, and who you support throughout your life. Whether you know you need them or not, they are there and your life is better because of it."

Guest artists Eva Patricia Rincón and Lawrence Fung created *Raíces*. Raíces reimages life after death with a dance film and live performance pairing. This work explores ancestry and the notion that no one ever really dies.




#### **ASSESSMENT CRITERIA**

- 1. Nominee must be an Arizona resident and United States citizen.
- 2. Excellence of the nominee's significant body of work, covering all aspects of artistic quality, creativity, innovation, and technical mastery.
- Quality and impact of the candidate's lifetime contribution to the development of dance in Arizona.
- 4. Advocacy for the field of dance on a regional and/or statewide level.
- 5. Recognition by peers as an influential figure in their respective dance communities.

**NOTE:** Members of the Arizona Dance Coalition are not eligible to receive an award in any year during which they are actively serving on the Board. No awards will be given posthumously. Awards will be given only to persons who are living on the date the recipients are announced publicly.


# **Need General Liability Insurance?**

Dance companies, choreographers, and students who present and produce concerts are usually required by the venues to provide General Liability Insurance (GLI) / Certificate of Insurance (COI) as part of the facility rental contract. The dance groups or individuals who only present one or two concerts per year may find that the cost of purchasing General Liability Insurance expensive or prohibitive.

For many years ADC has offered its *members* usage of its General Liability Insurance for short-term events (1-4 days) for a nominal fee. This program helps our members afford the coverage and keep their production costs down. This benefit is extended to ADC members in good standing.

# **Grants for Arts Projects** Deadlines February 9 & July 6, 2023

Grants for Arts Projects is our largest grants program for organizations, providing comprehensive and expansive funding opportunities for communities. Applicants may request cost share/ matching grants ranging from \$10,000 to \$100,000. Designated local arts agencies eligible to subgrant may request from \$30,000 to \$150,000 for subgranting programs in the Local Arts Agencies discipline. A minimum cost share/match equal to the grant amount is required.

# **Challenge America** Deadline April 27, 2023

Challenge America offers support primarily to small organizations for projects in all artistic disciplines that extend the reach of the arts to groups/communities with rich and dynamic artistic and cultural contributions to share that are underserved. Challenge America features an abbreviated application, a robust structure of technical assistance, and grants for a set amount of \$10,000. Grants require a cost share/match of \$10,000 consisting of cash and/or in-kind contributions. Total project costs must be at least \$20,000 or greater.
